WHAT IS AN ACCESS TO UNIVERSITY COURSE?

Access to University courses are specifically aimed at those aged 19 and over who would like to study at university but lack the necessary qualifications.

Covering a wide range of subject areas, our courses are the perfect way to provide the qualifications needed to move on to study at university.

What's more, we pride ourselves on providing an enjoyable learning experience where you leave us not only with new skills, but new-found confidence to pursue your new future.

GIVING YOU FLEXIBILITY TO MANAGE YOUR LIFE AND STUDIES

Time, money and existing commitments are often the barriers stopping us from pursuing our goals. To ensure this is not the case for you, we offer a range of options so returning to education is both possible and enjoyable.



Full-time

Entry requirements

You must have at least grade 4/C in GCSE English Language and maths. If you do not meet these requirements, please see the part-time section.

Attendance

You would be required to attend college for two full days per week and a half-day online session per week (at a time that suits you).

At certain points of the academic year and dependant on the modules you are studying, your days may be slightly shorter.

Occasionally you may be asked to attend college to complete certain aspects of online modules, but you will be given ample notice of such occasions.



Part-time

Entry requirements

You must have at least grade 4/C in GCSE English Language and maths.

If you don't meet these entry requirements, you will be required to complete a short diagnostic assessment for each GCSE that you need. You can then study for your GCSE(s) alongside your part-time Access to University course.

Attendance

You will undertake one full day in college for your Access to University course. However, if you are also studying both GCSEs and choose to do them in your first year with us, then you will be in college for a total of two days per week.

You are also required to allocate time to undertake self-study each week; 8 hours is a standard recommendation.

The part-time option is open to the majority of study pathways, but see pages 6 to 9 for the full details.





Part-time

Entry requirements

You must have at least grade 4/C in GCSE English Language and maths, plus proven experience of working online.

Attendance

You could complete this course within one year if you are able to dedicate 10 hours per week. However, this is flexible depending on what hours you can commit. Most students have completed their studies within 12-18 months.

Our online courses give you the flexibility to manage your life and studies:

- 24-hour access to your online course
- Maintain earning power while you learn
- Study around work or family commitments
- Study in the comfort of your own home.

COURSE STRUCTURE

To prepare you for the demands of higher-level study, our courses will test your skills beyond your focus topic.

This includes developing academic skills, learning how to write and reference assignments, and how to develop your confidence with interviews and presentations.

For each course, subjects are taught in a series of graded and ungraded units.

Each unit will contain either one or two formal assessments and these will be conducted via various methods such as essays, reports, presentations and examinations.

Every graded unit has to be passed in order for you to gain your Access to HE Diploma.

You will, of course, be given guidance and taught study skills throughout in order to help you with your work and assessments.

FULL-TIME COURSES

Grade 4/C or higher in GCSE English Language and maths.

BUSINESS



If you are looking for a first step into the corporate world, this course may be for you.

Fusing the two related fields of law and business, this course gives you the underpinning knowledge about organisations, marketing, law and so much more. It is an ideal course if you want to become a specialist or even run your own business one day.

Throughout the course, you will study maths, human biology, sociology and psychology. This will provide you with a good foundation for a wide range of university courses within the health and care sector, including those offered by Nottingham Trent University and can be studied on-site at our Derby Road campus.

LAW**



Fusing the two related fields of law and business, this course has a broad range of progression routes and studies varied topics.

Across both mandatory and optional units, you will learn about the English legal system, contract law, marketing and more. You will also conduct an individual research project on a topic related to business or law.

In terms of progression, this course is a great first step towards a wide-range of careers, including becoming a barrister, solicitor, criminologist or working within business and corporate management.

SCIENCES

As part of this course, you must also arrange a work placement in a school for at least 21 days.

MIDWIFERY



NURSING



Have you always dreamt of becoming a midwife? Or, are you considering a career change into a profession that is more rewarding and help others?

During your studies, you will study health and wellbeing, cell biology, human reproduction, growth and development, the roles and responsibilities of the midwife, human nutrition and the digestive system, cell division and heredity (health) and human immunity.

It is strongly advised that you complete a work placement or volunteer in health care before joining the course.

Whether it's your dream job, or a desire to change career, choosing to be a nurse is one of the most rewarding decisions you will ever make.

Enabling you to pursue a variety of nursing roles, this course covers health and wellbeing, cell biology, human nutrition and the digestive system, the roles and responsibilities of the registered nurse, the human endocrine and nervous system, classification and use of social drugs and medicines, sociology and psychology.



"Going back to studying was initially a shock, but thanks to the support from the tutors, I found it easier to manage studying and working a full-time job.



FEES AND FINANCIAL SUPPORT

For many, cost is a barrier to learning. However, this doesn't have to be the case.

Funding is available for eligible adults on most courses, so always speak to us on **0808 100 3626** to see if your circumstances mean that your fees can be waived or reduced.

FINANCIAI SUPPORT

Bursaries

If you have an annual household income below £40,000, you could be entitled to:

- Monthly attendance related bursary payments
- A West Notts College Travel Pass (find out more wnc.ac.uk/travel-pass)
- Childcare funding/Care to Learn
- Support for compulsory kit/uniform.

There are two different bursaries available to help with education costs, the 19+ Student Support Fund and the Advanced Learner Loan Bursary Fund*. Bursary payments don't have to be paid back.

SUPPORT FOR PAYING FOR COURSE FEES

Advanced Learner Loan

This loan is to help pay for course fees (where eligible), so no payment is required upfront to start the course. To be eligible you must:

- Be aged 19 or over at the start of your course
- Be studying an eligible course (includes Access to University)
- Be a resident in the UK for at least 3 years prior to starting the course.

You won't have to pay the loan back until you are earning over £25,000 per year and it will be written off after 30 years. If at any time your earnings fall below £25,000 – repayments will stop until you're earning over this amount again.

Best of all, if you successfully go on to complete a Higher Education qualification following an Access to University course, you won't have to pay the loan back at all.

As part of a new government scheme, if you're aged 19 or over and don't already have existing A Levels (or a Level 3 qualification), are unemployed or earn below £20,319 you may be able to study for an Access to University course for FREE.
