WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP?

An apprenticeship is essentially a job with training that anyone over the age of 16 and living in the UK can apply for. As an apprentice, you will:

- Train alongside industry experts
- Gain essential experience
- Work towards nationally-recognised standards
- Complete training in-house with your employer or with a training provider such as a college
- Earn a wage
- Be entitled to company benefits (including paid holidays).

You may also work towards additional qualifications relevant to your role, including English, maths and ICT skills if you do not have a grade 4 or above.

- Put in the effort As with any job, you want your application to stand out so set time aside to concentrate on your application and make it unique.
- Make a good first impression Double check your spelling, grammar and statements to show you pay attention to
- **Practice and prepare** As part of your application, you will need to successfully pass an interview. Give yourself the best chance of succeeding by working with the college's apprenticeship and support teams. They can help you to prepare for questions and help to manage any feelings of nerves or anxiety.
- **Be yourself** Employers not only look for candidates with the right skills, but also the right attitude and values for their company. Tell them what achievements you're proud of, what motivates you and why you're
